## About this workshop

Despite efforts to embrace diversity, equity and inclusion, members of minority groups continue to experience bias, inequities, microaggressions, and discriminatory experiences in the workplace. Taking place in the day-to-day, these experiences are correlated to decreased satisfaction, burnout and depression, work disengagement, higher turn over and other health and social issues. More inclusive workplaces are instead associated with greater satisfaction and retention, improved engagement, higher sense of belonging and increased innovation. In this presentation, we provide a comprehensive look at what microaggressions are and their impacts. It also looks at the role and accountability of the ecosystem and its members in the face of microaggressions, as well as strategies that can be deployed at the individual and organizational levels.
